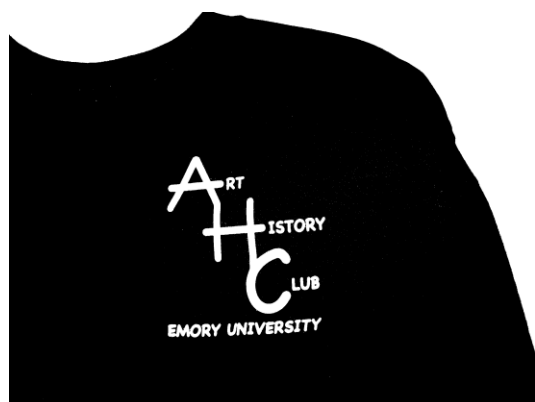


Want to join the action in Art History?

The Architecture Club (TAC)

Brings together students from a number of fields who are interested in architecture; many are pursuing the Architectural Studies Minor in the Art History department.

TAC meets throughout the year and hosts an active Learnlink conference relating to things architectural. Field trips to architectural firms in Atlanta and buildings or exhibitions of interest as well as to lectures at Georgia Tech are regularly scheduled, as are discussion sessions, workshops and guest speakers, often Emory alums working as architects in the Atlanta area. In the fall there is usually a presentation by Emory students who have participated in the Harvard Career Discovery Program or the Columbia Introduction to Architecture course over the summer. Also in the fall there is a workshop on portfolio preparation for students applying to graduate schools of architecture. TAC activities in the past have included volunteer work on Habitat for Humanity builds, Mad Houser shelters for the homeless, and work with the Atlanta chapter of Architecture for Humanity.
