Does it relate to another discipline that interests you? Did a particular book, article, or scholar influence your decision to pursue this topic? Please include a short, working bibliography of 3-4 sources.

Candidates for Honors in Art History must complete an original research paper of at least 30 pages (excluding bibliography and illustrations) and successfully defend it before a committee of at least three faculty members. Candidates are required to meet regularly with their thesis advisors, to present their work-in-progress at a department symposium, to take one graduate-level course in art history for a letter grade, to maintain an overall GPA of at least 3.70, and to meet College deadlines.
